- 5. "Haecceity" (Duns Scotus) "that incommunicable nature which constitutes the individual difference, or individualizes singular beings beloning to a class; hence the principle of individuation" "thisness" Thomas Aquinas 1225-1274: "this flesh, these bones" existentialism and the coordinates of time and space.
- 6. "Nominalism" theory that abstracts or general terms, or universals, represent no objective real existence or existents, but are merely words or names, mere vocal utterances, "flatus voces" W C Williams: "no ideas but in things" -
